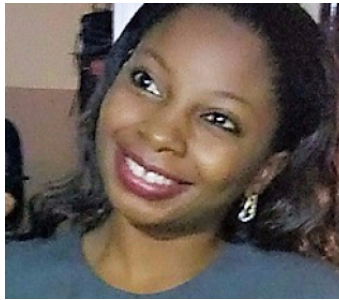

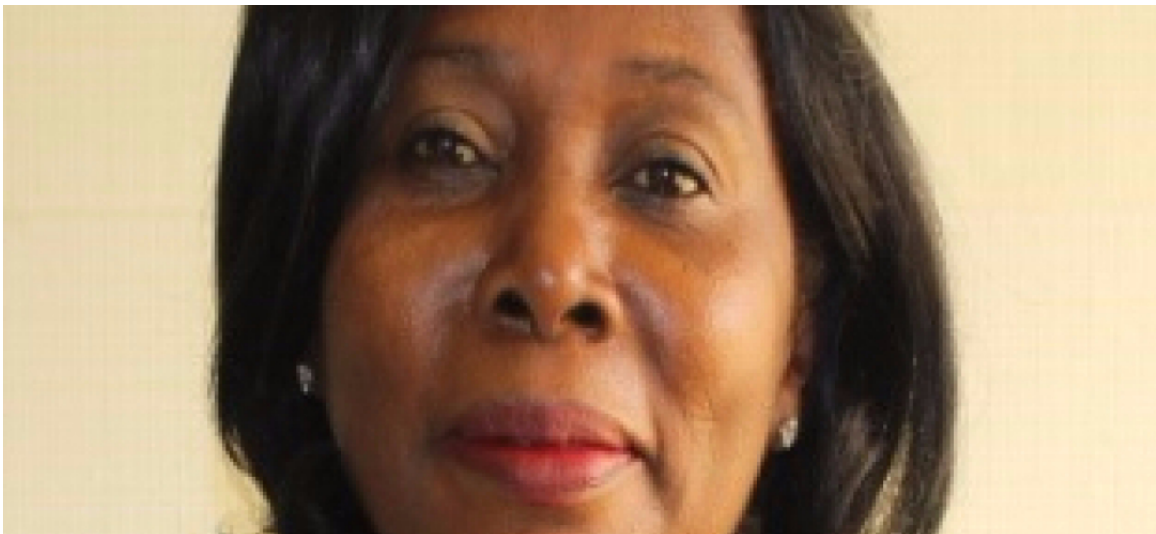

Water Supply and Sanitation Collaborative Council on 17th of August, 2017 at the SmaileView Hotel, Makurdi, Benue State trained the Network of Water and Sanitation in Nigeria (NEWSAN) on advocacy, communication and NGO Coordination to strengthen her capacity to effectively engage all

stakeholders at all levels to drive country interventions on WASH.

The training on advocacy emphasized on the following;

- Team building
- Data: using statistics to get urban water and sanitation issues
- Identification of areas of specialization
- Setting goals and objectives: budgets should be reasonable.
- Gathering support at all levels.
- The need for developing appropriate messages
- Identifying and using appropriate channels of communication
- Conducting Monitoring and evaluation; assessment of achievements, process indicators and impact indicators as well as
- Documentation

Communication being an integral part for visibility, NEWSAN was trained on communication processes which included message development, using appropriate channels of communication, getting feedback as well as monitoring and evaluating the feedback for further engagement.

The training on communication also emphasized building a communication strategy to address all communication challenges.

NEWSAN was also trained on NGO coordination towards building her capacity to coordinate other NGOs who are part of NEWSAN for more effective impact at all levels
