Adebiyi-Abiola, Bilikiss

Bilikiss Adebiyi-Abiola is an entrepreneur who founded the Lagos-based recycling company 'Wecyclers'. She is currently the Director General of the Lagos State Records and Archives Bureau (LASRAB) and Managing Director of the Lagos State Parks and Gardens Agency (LASPARK). She is also a member of the Board of Trustees of the Lagos State Employment Trust Fund. In 2012, she co-founded Wecyclers, a company that collects recyclable rubbish from households in Lagos. When the business started, Adebiyi would take out a tricycle to do collections to find out more about her new business. Once the rubbish is sorted, her company sends SMS back to the

household, informing them of how many points they have earned for trading in the rubbish. These points could be converted for food, cleaning products, or cellphone minutes. The company works in partnership with the Lagos Waste Management Authority. In 2017, Abebiyi stepped down as the CEO of Wecyclers to become the Managing Director of the Lagos State Parks and Gardens Agency (LASPARK). In her new role, she will be keeping open space in Lagos State attractive and carry out tree planting. She is currently the Director General of Lagos State Records and Archives Bureau (LASRAB).





Adefemi Miss, Adeola

Adeola Adefemi is an award-winning teacher and facilitator who is passionate about promoting quality education for children, especially marginalized ones in her community. She currently teaches the English Language at Oke-Odo Senior High School, Alimosho.

Adeola Adefemi started her teaching career in a school labeled "lowperforming," following years of poor performance by students in external and regional examinations. As an innovative teacher. Adeola understood that extracurricular activities, afterschool classes, and competitions can help to boost students' academic performance. Thus, she launched the EVERY CHILD COUNTS campaign, creating subject-associated clubs that students joined based on their interests. To build confidence in her students, she also encouraged them to engage in inter-school, state, and national competitions after months of intensive training and mentorship. Within a year, Adeola's school had won over 30 competitions, and in two years, the school won the African Top School Award for exceptional academic performance.

Adeola also launched the CHILD NOT BRIDE campaign to address the problems faced by the girl child in society. By using stage plays and poetry, she was able to effectively depict the dangers of these practices and emphasized the need for them to be stopped. The campaign also helped train girls in entrepreneurial skills that would help them sponsor themselves through college if other funding options were not available. In a career spanning over nine years, Adeola's students have won over 103 states, national and international competitions, including the Commonwealth Day Inter-School Competition, United Nations Poetry Competition, BRF Essay Competition (United Kingdom), Blooming Mind National Writing Competition, Teenage Festival of Life and the World Water Day Competition. Currently, the pass rate of her students has risen from 24% to 88%. Lots of them are on national and international scholarships, about six were allowed to travel to the United Kingdom on an educational tour for winning the Be Road-Friendly Essay Competition, while sixty students received



commendation letters from the state government.

Adeola completed a bachelor's degree from Olabisi Onabanjo University and other degrees/certifications from the University of Sussex and Saylor Academy. She is a Fullbright Fellow, a Certified Microsoft Innovative Educator, and a member of the Young African Leader Initiative (YALI). In recognition of her efforts in education. Adeola has received numerous awards including Outstanding Teacher of the Year 2019, Maltina That One Teacher 2019, JCI Outstanding Young Person in Nigeria 2019, Ten Young Persons in Nigeria 2019, Lockdown Teacher 2020, Fulbright Teaching Excellence and Achievement Award 2020, Lagos State Best Teacher 2021, and most recently, on the 2022 World Teachers' Day, she was announced as The Best Teacher In Nigeria.


Silas is now co-founder and CEO of R.I. which is developing a quick and secure device and data platform for

The decade since has seen him qualify with ACCA and, in 2021, cofound Heala Tech, a start-up in the fast-growing Nigerian healthtech space, with two others who share his aspirations. The business launched in the wake of the Covid-19 pandemic, on the back of a softening in attitudes to virtual healthcare. In the past, patients in Nigeria, as in many countries, expected to see a doctor in person,' Adeyemi-Levites says. 'The pandemic changed that narrative. Now people are more willing to visit a doctor online.'

Using technology, the firm aims to bridge the gaps between individuals and healthcare providers pharmacies, hospitals, dental centres and the like. Patients, meanwhile, can download an app that enables them to check symptoms, access 24/7 medical support and take control of personal health records. Adevemi-Levites exhibits huge enthusiasm for his 'vision'. He says: 'I want to solve big problems, which you can't do as an employee. I want to build something where the decisions I make will spiral down to every healthcare seeker out there. As



a doctor helping one patient at a time, it would take more than a lifetime to make that sort of impact.' In a nation with some of the world's worst health statistics, the move towards integrated healthcare is key to improving access to medical services. Nigeria, which is set to become the world's third-most populated country by 2050 (after India and China), has an average life expectancy of 54 – the fifth lowest in the world – while the country accounts for 20% of maternal deaths globally.

Adigwe beat thousands of contenders to emerge the first prominent healthcare chief executive to clinch the highly coveted award.

Officials at the Ministry of Labour and Employment indicate that Adigwe emerged tops following a vigorous evidence-based selection process that reviewed hard-work, excellence, innovation and productivity output from 2017 to 2020.

Recall that in 2017 and 2018, Adigwe had, as executive secretary of Pharmaceutical Manufacturers Group of Manufacturers Association of Nigeria (PMG-MAN) led advocacy efforts to reverse the insidious Common External Tariff (CET), which threatened the entire Pharma Industry.

Along with S. Okey Akpa, the president of the West African Pharma Manufacturers Association, he conceptualised the Medicines Security Concept, which laid the foundation for drug and vaccines manufacturing initiatives that have taken centre stage following the COVID-19 pandemic.

Earlier, he had made his mark by designing and implementing the robust and comprehensive advocacy plan that led to the ring-fencing of local manufacture for several main categories of medicines in the 2016 National Fiscal Policy.

Analysis shows that this landmark intervention led to double digit sectoral growth in the indicated areas, as well as inflow of millions of dollars of new investment, and the



creation of thousands of direct and indirect jobs in the sector. During the COVID-19 pandemic, Adigwe's maverick performance as Director General of the National Institute for Pharmaceutical Research and Development (NIPRD) led to Nigeria's emergence as a leading scientific authority in evidence-based policymaking. Notably, he led the team that provided the first international categorical analysis on the COVID organics preparation which then underpinned decision making that saved countless lives and conserved millions of dollars. Adigwe also convened the first National Scientific Advisory Committee (NSAC) for verification and validation of phyto claims. 

Professor Agbiboa's research and teaching focus on how state and nonstate forms of order and authority interpenetrate and shape each other, and the spatialization and materialization of mobility, power, and politics in contemporary African cities. He is the author of They Eat Our Sweat: Transport Labor, Corruption, and Everyday Survival in Urban Nigeria (Oxford University Press, 2022) and Mobility, Mobilization, and Counter/Insurgency: The Routes of Terror in an African Context (University of Michigan Press, 2022, Winner of the Lee Ann Fujii Best Book Award and the ISA Peace Best Book Prize); co-author of People,





Morenike has won multiple awards and is a chartered accountant, executive producer, TV presenter, author and motivational public speaker.









Tobi Amusan is a Nigerian track and field athlete who specialises in the 100 metres hurdles and also competes as a sprinter. She is the current World, Commonwealth and African champion in the 100 m hurdles, as well as the meet record holder in those three competitions. Amusan became the first ever Nigerian world champion and world record holder in an athletics event when she won the 2022 World Championships 100 m

hurdles gold medal, setting the current world record of 12.12 seconds in the semi-final, followed up by a wind-assisted 12.06 s in the final. She won back-to-back Commonwealth and African titles in 2018 and 2022 in the 100m hurdles and is also a two-time African Games champion in the event.

In 2015, Amusan took gold in the 100 m hurdles at the African Junior

Championships and the same year, as an 18-year-old, secured her first title at the African Games. In 2021, Amusan became the first Nigerian athlete to win a Diamond League title as she took the 100 m hurdles trophy, breaking the then-African record held by Glory Alozie in the process.[7] She retained her title in 2022.




He creates awareness, enlightens, mobilizes and trains both community

Igini's message to Nigerians ring true, because as he said, "if we create deprived families, we harvest desperate and unethical citizens." In




Igini therefore could be found the public officer as a defender of the dispossessed and deprived citizens.

Since starting the hospital with just \$333, this Haggai International alumnus has grown his vision from a staff of one to approximately 150; from a four-room apartment to a three-floor hospital complex. And

In addition, he has launched an HIV/AIDS monthly support group, a Celebrate Recovery program, and a daycare center.

"Greymate Care was born out of personal pain, which was finding a caregiver for my grandmother when she was sick. According to Madubuko, Greymate Care now manages over 1,000 caregivers, all of whom are trained in food hygiene, principal

For Madubuko, Greymate Care's origins are personal. While studying at university in England, she volunteered in a hospital as a caregiver. 

autism and brought greater understanding and awareness to the peculiarities of this syndrome. Fear, shame, ignorance and stigma that are typically used to characterise families whose wards are living with autism are greatly reduced as a result of his advocacy and public education initiatives.

He can be referred to as a 'champion of autism awareness' due his charismatic advocacy. He spreads love and encouragement to families with children living on the spectrum. His advocacy has sparked significant interest and change. Being a doting father of a remarkable, autistic son, and witnessing how

difficult it is to fill that role, in addition to being pressured and restricted by a society that has not invested much interest in how to manage children with such challenges has made him empathetic and shaped his aspirations to beam as much light as possible on the developmental

disorder and is helping to get the attention of the relevant stakeholders. Nzan's advocacy has helped disillusioned families find hope. He offers the possibility of a better world, where children living with autism can develop their potential, maximise the opportunities around them, follow their dreams and fulfil their destinies.

On the practical side, his Foundation provides succour, empathy, and physical assistance to vulnerable families with autistic children with special needs.

Understanding the power of informed community action, he advocates for quality care and attention for all children living with autism. He believes that everyone's voice matters and is needed to create a better framework for the world. He is enjoining people of goodwill to join him to create a world which will be better than how we all met it.





She is also the daughter of Nigerian business magnate, investor and philanthropist Captain Hosa Wells Okunbo. After his coronation in August 2021, the Olu of Warri bestowed a new title on his wife, calling her Olori Atuwatse III, now her official title.

Olori Atuwatse III has been involved in several endeavours targeting women and children, including the Captain Idahosa Wells Okunbo Stem Innovation Centre, which she established in honour of her father. She has also initiated several intervention programs for the poor in Delta State, including a 2022 visit to the Ureju Community, an oil rich slum suffering the effects of environmental degradation and Iyara, another slum community. 


Osimhen, Victor James

These included the Ministries of Justice, Women's Affairs and Health. Data was also sourced from government-owned Sexual Assault Referral Centres (SARCS) and state universities. It has also been launched just as states head to the polls to pick their next governors.







fellow young people to take on the mantle of leadership.










Umeonyiora, Emmanuel Ikechukwu


that today is adopted by all banks operating in Nigeria, including the Central Bank of Nigeria.
